

**Arsenic** is a naturally occurring metal-like substance commonly found in Arizona's groundwater. Using water with arsenic in it can potentially harm your health.

## Health Effects of Drinking Water with Arsenic

If you drink water with arsenic, you may have a higher chance of developing:

- Skin problems: Thickening and discoloration of the skin
- Nervous system problems: Numbness in the hands and feet and pain
- Cancer: Higher chance of skin, lung, bladder, liver, kidney, or prostate cancer
- Lung and heart diseases
- Childhood development issues

Too much arsenic in a short time may cause symptoms such as:

- Nausea and vomiting
- Abdominal pain and bloody or rice water diarrhea
- Numbness and tingling the hands and feet

Arsenic carries potential health risks depending on your personal health status and exposure. Exposure includes how much arsenic you were in contact with, how you were exposed (drinking, eating, breathing, or skin contact), how often you were exposed, and how long you were exposed. Not everyone who is exposed to arsenic experiences negative health effects. Children, older adults, those with chronic illnesses, and unborn babies are more sensitive to arsenic exposure.

## **Test Your Well Water**

**Tip:** Compare your results to the **EPA's Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL)**, which is the highest allowed concentration of a substance in drinking water. The MCL for arsenic in drinking water is **10 ppb (parts per billion)**.
